REGIONAL OFFICIAL LANGUAGE CONFERENCE

(a) whether the Department of Official Languages organizes Regional Official Language conferences in the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the number of Regional Official Language conferences held during each of the last three years and the current year;

(d) whether the Government gives encouragement to hold Regional Official Languages conferences in the country; and

(e) if so, the details thereof?

(a): Yes, Madam.

(b): The Department of Official Language organizes regional official language conferences to promote the use of Hindi in official work, to provide a forum for interaction regarding the progressive use of Hindi and to provide up-dated information on the technical facilities related to the use of Hindi on Computers. In these seminars Rajbhasha Shields are given away to the attached/subordinate offices of Central Govt/PSUs/Banks and Town Official Language Implementation Committees for outstanding achievement in implementation of official language policy of the Union.

(c): During the year 2011-12 five conferences (Mysore, Patna, Guwahati, Aurangabad and Dehradun), during the year 2012-13 two conferences (Ahmedabad and Bengaluru) and during the year 2013-14 six conferences (Kolkata, Chandigarh, Indore, Chennai, Bhuvaneshwar and Chandigarh) were organized. During the current year, one conference has been organized in Lucknow.

(d) & (e): Yes, Madam. The target is to organise four regional official language conferences during a year and financial provisions are made for this purpose. 88 conferences have been organized since 1985 .
